Background

The project MEDHUB (Knowledge Hub on the Euro-Mediterranean Region) is an 18-month Jean Monnet project, financed by the European Commission and coordinated by the EMUNI University. Over the course of 7 events (an opening conference, 5 workshops on various themes relevant to the Mediterranean region and a closing conference), the project seeks to establish an academia-policy dialogue and draft recommendations for university curricula to the benefit of the Euro-Mediterranean region. The Final Conference of the project will disseminate the key conclusions of the 5 prior workshops and reflect on the future of teaching and researching the Euro-Mediterranean studies. Finally, it will provide networking opportunities for participants, coming from policy makers, academics, students, researchers and other professionals.
